PRINCIPAL'S ACTIVITIES REPORT
2022 – 2023**

A. ACADEMIC PROJECTS

1. ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNING PROJECTS

a. Outstanding English Ambassador Award

A bigger team of 70 English Ambassadors were recruited to provide support to the running of game booths on the Information Session on Application for S1 Discretionary Places (December 2022) and during the English Carnival (March 2023). The students were active, helpful and very committed and thus some packed stationery sets were purchased for them as small gifts.

b. English Reading Scheme

Recognizing students' efforts on reading, the award scheme continued to motivate students to read extensively after lessons. A total of 100 students from S1 to S5 were presented the awards based on their reading records.

c. English Writing Competition

Students were assigned to write on a topic set by the teachers of the level concerned. Three prizes were given in each form from S2 to S5. Prizes were presented to a total of 12 students in the form of book coupons.

2. CHINESE LANGUAGE LEARNING PROJECTS

a. Academic support

i. 13 students receiving CSSA / full fee remission were subsidized for attending the Chinese interest class. The performance of the students was satisfactory and they managed to fulfil the course requirements.

ii. Under the writing award scheme implemented this school year, the Chinese teacher of each class nominated the student with the best overall performance in composition writing in the school year to get the award. This award managed to spur students to produce quality work throughout the school year.

3. LUNAR NEW YEAR FAIR STALL

a. As the Lunar New Year Fair in Victoria Park was cancelled again while the Lunar New Year Fair stall was set up at school instead, no money was spent on bidding a stall and setting up one.

b. For the preparation of Lunar New Year Fair Stall to be operated at School on Alumni Homecoming cum Fundraising Day (10 December 2022), some sundry

items were purchased.

4. PROMOTION OF STEM EDUCATION

Purchase of 32 iPads with Apple Pencils and charging cart

- The tablets purchased facilitated new eTeaching and eLearning initiative after the installation of touch panels in our classrooms while the charging cart provided a mobilized charging solution for tablets.
- The actual expenditure was less than the grant demanded by more than 15% since there was an introduction of a new iPad model in October 2022. The Apple inc. cut prices on our purchased model and accessories. Also, since our school is planning to implement “Bring Your Own Devices” (BYOD) in the coming few years progressively, we chose a model with smaller storage than we originally expected after thoughtful consideration of the needs of providing shared devices for students.

Organizing a STEM course

A STEM course on “Smart Home” was organized for 12 S1 and S2 students during the Activity Days. The course provided hands-on activities through which students could learn the latest technology on IoT (Internet of Things) and programming techniques.

From the student survey conducted, all the respondents agreed that their problem-solving skills were enhanced and 80% of the respondents agreed that their computational thinking skills were enhanced after participating in the STEM course.

5. GIFTED EDUCATION PROGRAMMES

The expenses of junior-form students joining gifted education programmes organized by local tertiary institutions were subsidized. The subsidy has effectively encouraged bright students to stretch their potential in various domains and enhance their exposure by joining external programmes, especially those held during the summer vacation.

B. WHOLE-PERSON DEVELOPMENT

1. SUBSIDY FOR EXPENSES OF JUNIOR FORM STUDENTS JOINING COURSES OF OTHER LANGUAGES

No student has officially applied for a subsidy on language course throughout the year. Hence, no reimbursement was made.

2. RED CROSS YOUTH TEAM

The expenses were spent in supporting the operation of the Team, preparation for

competitions and organizing the enrollment ceremony for new members held on 22 July 2023. The performance of the Red Cross Youth Team in competitions was once again pleasing with the following prizes captured:

3. SERVICE LEARNING PROGRAMME

The Global Learning Committee agreed beforehand that there should not be too many cross-border or overseas exchange activities organized for students, so as to free their time to support their preparation for the 55th Anniversary Variety Show. Therefore, no service learning exchange programmes were organized.

4. PARTICIPATION OF DISADVANTAGED STUDENTS IN STUDY TOURS

11 students participating in the Fukuoka & Nagasaki historical and cultural study tour held by the School in the period 2 – 7 July 2023 were recipients of the Student Financial Assistance Scheme (6 students receiving full grant and 5 students receiving half grant). A total amount of \$46,000 (\$6,000×6 + \$2,000×5) was claimed to subsidize these participants.

C. AWARDS

1. TOPPING UP AWARDS FOR STUDENTS

A subsidy was granted to keep the values of the awards for the Graduation Day prize winners (those getting 1st – 3rd prizes, subject prizes and the service award) in line with inflation in recent years and to embody their importance.

2. LANGUAGE LEARNING AWARD

The award can encourage students to be biliterate and trilingual rather than merely focus on polishing the English skills.

3. ACTIVE LEARNING AWARD

To encourage students to adopt an active learning attitude, an award was offered to those considered by a number of subject teachers as showing the attitude. In the first term, there were 69 S1 - S3 award winners and 33 S4 - S6 award winners while in the second term, there were 58 S1 - S3 award winners and 37 S4 & S5 winners.

4. CCSC ALUMNI FOUNDATION FUND COMMENDABLE SERVICE AWARD

a. The award would be offered to those students with active participation in the Red Cross Youth Team or the Community Services Student Team.

This award scheme was praiseworthy as it encouraged students who excelled academically and morally to join the Prefect Body and devote wholeheartedly to their duties. The awardees also appreciated the recognition given by the CCSC Alumni Foundation Fund.

10. GLOBAL LEARNING AWARD

- a. The awardees would act as team leaders of study tours and participate actively so as to enhance the learning atmosphere. They would also be responsible for conducting post-tour sharing during school assemblies. The basic personal attributes required included rich relevant subject knowledge, an outgoing and helpful personality, a proactive attitude, good presentation skills and an average socio-economic background.
- b. Since the appraisal procedure for the award winners still had not been completed,

the award would be given out only in the school year 2023/24 and so no expense was recorded even if the organization of study tours had been resumed.

D. SUBSIDIZING PSYCHIATRIC DIAGNOSIS OR TREATMENT FOR STUDENTS FROM LOW-INCOME FAMILY

- a. Students from low-income families could be subsidized to get psychiatric diagnosis from private psychiatrists and also seek follow-up psychiatric consultations provided that they were not eligible to apply for the community support scheme under the Chow Tai Fook Medical Foundation.
- b. There were 3 new cases related to mental illness last year. One of them got subsidized from the fund for seeking psychiatric diagnosis and treatment; another one was eligible but refused to get subsidized because the family had financial support from an NGO; and the last one did not want to disclose the financial condition of the family and refused our financial support.

E. CONSUMABLES AND SUNDRY ITEMS

1,500 plastic folders were produced for promoting the Fund. It was distributed to the alumni on such occasions as the Alumni Homecoming and Fundraising Day (10 Dec 2022) and the Annual Dinner of the Old Students' Association (15 Apr 2023).
