1. CCSC ALUMNI FOUNDATION FUND OUTSTANDING SERVICE AWARD

2010/11 Awardees: Siu Wing Tung (S3A), Kwan Hiu Lam (S4C), Chu Hoi Tik (S5A) and Lai Man Sin (S5A)

Subsidies used for book coupons = \$1,600

2011/12 Awardees: Siu Wing Tung (S4D), Li Ka Wa (S5A), Chan Tai Yin (S5B), Chan Natalie Lai Yee (S5C) and Shum Lok Ting (S5C)

Subsidies required for book coupons in the coming school year = \$2,000

2. CCSC ALUMNI FOUNDATION FUND COMMENDABLE SERVICE AWARD

Subsidies used for book coupons = \$800

3. CCSC SAGE ELDER ACADEMY

i) Fun Fair from 22 – 23 September 2011 to promote the activities of Elder Academy Student Team for the whole school

Subsidies used for decorating display board = \$60

ii) 11 S3 - S5 students participated in a visit to the Hong Kong Society for the Aged Eastern District Elderly Community Centre (香港耆康老人福利會東區長者地區中心), making desserts with about 10 elders on 19 May 2012

Subsidies used for buying materials for making desserts with the elders = \$357.30

4. SERVICE LEARNING TRIP TO CHINA (岩背學習交流體驗營)

18 S4 and S5 students led by Mr. Tong Ling Poon and Miss Kong Tsui Yan will go to Yan Bei, Guangdong from 19 – 24 August 2012, teaching the local primary students English

Subsidies to be used for the trip = \$5,000

5. COMMUNITY SERVICES

i) Fun Fair from 22 – 23 September 2011 to promote the activities of Community Services Student Team for the whole school.

Subsidies used for decorating display board = \$134.50

ii) Donation to Foodbank (including a PowerPoint slide show shown in the Form-teacher Period, food collection from each class, transport of food and sharing session during school assembly)

Subsidies used for decorating display board and transportation fee by truck for transporting the food to the Foodbank = \$95

- iii) 33 S3 – S5 students participated in a visit to the visually impaired and blind on 4 February 2012 co-organized with the Pentecostal Holiness Church Ling Kwong Bradbury Centre for the Blind (五旬節聖潔會靈光白普理失明人中心).

Subsidies used for buying materials for making dumplings with the blind and materials for games = \$485.6

9. DRAMAS WITH MORAL VALUES

i) “象人” - Drama by Chung Ying Theatre Co.

Synopsis: 在殘缺的身體裡，有著一顆最純潔的心靈。最卑微的，也是最高貴的；最殘缺的，也是最美麗的... 19 世紀，頭部畸型的象人約翰梅里克從小被父母拋棄，被馬戲團團主收容，成為娛樂大眾的怪物，約翰在馬戲團中受盡不人道的待遇，也未得到良好的醫療照護。直到遇上一名英國外科權威崔佛士醫生將他收留在醫院裡並給予妥善的照顧。在崔佛士醫生的悉心照護下，讓他感受到從未體驗過的關懷，也讓他體驗到人間的溫暖，使得之前只能帶著面具示人的約翰，重新找回作為一個「人」的尊嚴...

ii) “十二怒漢” - Drama by Theatre Space

Synopsis: 一名少年被控謀殺父親。法庭內，樓下老伯作供聲稱親耳聽到他大罵「我要殺死你」；對街女人作供聲稱親眼目睹他以刀刺進父親胸口；雜貨店老闆作供聲稱曾售賣兇器予少年。似乎，被判死刑將會是他的結局。陪審團由十二位素未謀面的人組成，聽畢審訊退庭商議。無論陪審團作出任何裁決，必須一致。看似定局已成的判決由於其中一人的異議而爆發成激烈的爭論。十二名陪審員將如何決定少年的生死？

iii) “有飯自然香” - Drama by Hong Kong Repertory Theatre

Synopsis: 六十年代的故事，重拾當年香港人的核心價值及家庭觀念。歷盡艱辛偷渡來港的阿標，為充饑在「然香仙館」偷了一碗飯吃為故事的開始，及後更為了賺一口飯，發奮圖強，因緣際會成了電器師傅，並委任推銷手提收音機與及幾經改良的新產品——電飯煲。唯在反日情緒高漲的年代，遇上群眾抵制，

望著那碗香軟米飯，又如何克服困境？
