PRINCIPAL'S ACTIVITIES REPORT
2015 – 2016**

1. MORAL EDUCATION TALKS

A talk and guided tour on the rule of law was arranged for S4 for \$800 while a sex education talk was organized and \$3,750 was spent on it.

2. TALKS AND WORKSHOP ON LOCAL HERITAGE

Such activities were organized for S1. During the Form-teacher periods, 3 talks were held: 香港交通歷史、香港國家級非物質文化遺產及香港百載報業史. Moreover, a tour and a workshop - 大坑非遺考察之旅及執字粒工作坊 – were organized. Such activities managed to arouse the interest of the participants and were conducive to their better understanding of local culture. Altogether \$2,500 was spent.

3. RESPECT TEACHER CAMPAIGN

A board displaying photos showing gratitude to teachers was prepared and \$272.1 was spent on the board materials.

6. SERVICE LEARNING PROGRAMME

5 S4 & S5 students participated in the Guangxi Volunteer Teaching Programme during the Easter holiday. They were placed in a rural school in which they conducted English lessons and extracurricular activities for students from farm families. The programme was fully subsidized by the Alumni Foundation Fund and \$9,000 was reimbursed.

7. COMMUNITY SERVICES

- a. The Fun Fair was held in October 2015 to promote the activities of Community Services Student Team to the whole school.

Subsidies used for decorating the display board = \$184.2

- b. 15 S3 - S5 students participated in a visit to the centre of the Heep Hong Society, Wan Chui Centre (協康會環翠中心) and completed an integration activity with some children with intellectual disabilities on 19 December 2015.

Subsidies used for buying materials for the activity = \$72

- c. In March and April 2016, some integration activities among our students and South Asian children were arranged. A few gatherings were held which included ice-breaking games at the community centre and an outing activity to the Hong Kong Science Museum. Such activity was co-organized with the Salvation Army Chai Wan Integrated Service for Young People (救世軍柴灣青少年綜合服務).

Subsidies used for buying materials for the games during the visit and orienteering = \$277.8

8. CCSC SAGE ELDER ACADEMY

Some students participated in a visit to the Hong Kong Society for the Aged Eastern District Elderly Community Centre (香港耆康老人福利會東區長者地區中心), carrying out an integration activity for the elderly on the 23 July, 2016.

Subsidies used for buying food for the elderly = \$374.9

13. ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNING PROJECTS

a. Outstanding English Ambassador Award (Budget = \$2,000; expenditure = \$1,630)

As commented by the teacher in charge of the English Ambassadors, all members (43 students) this year had provided strong support to the School in running different activities to promote the English-speaking atmosphere. They were presented the awards - the English book coupons for the English Book Fair held at school in the second term. The value ranged from \$30 to \$60, subject to the commitment and contribution of students as observed by the English teachers concerned.

b. English Reading Scheme (Budget = \$6,900; expenditure = \$5,700)

114 S1 to S5 students were nominated for the awards under the Reading Scheme. The

awardees were presented book coupons to be used in the English Book Fair at school. As remarked by the teachers, the award scheme gave students an incentive to develop a reading habit and it was a pleasure to see students reading not just storybooks, but also materials covering pop culture and current issues.

18. LUNAR NEW YEAR FAIR STALL

a. CCSC Alumni Foundation Fund

The Lunar New Year Fair Stall of our School was set up at the Victoria Park and managed by 79 S5 BAFS students. The total amount of investment for the project was around \$100,000 this year and the Alumni Foundation Fund contributed \$24,300. Hence, the money from the Fund greatly facilitated the running of the activity. A profit of \$13,509.18 was recorded for the investment made by the Fund.

b. CCSC Alumni Foundation Fund- Lunar New Year Fair Fund

\$3,232.13 was reimbursed from the fund. Part of the money was spent in purchasing display trolleys and display racks supporting the operation of the Lunar New Year Fair Stall. Moreover, travelling expenses incurred by the teaching staff visiting the Mainland suppliers were also subsidized by the fund.
