No expenditure is recorded for subsidizing the Community Service Student Team as there is still reserve for the Team.

4. SERVICE LEARNING PROGRAMME

The activities could not be held due to the outbreak of the coronavirus disease in China.

5. RED CROSS YOUTH TEAM

Due to the severe coronavirus condition, the enrollment ceremony was cancelled.

6. LUNAR NEW YEAR FAIR STALL

a. CCSC Alumni Foundation Fund

As the Lunar New Year Fair stall was set up at school instead of at Victoria Park since the sale of dry good was banned by the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department, no expense was reimbursed from the fund for bidding a stall.

b. CCSC Alumni Foundation Fund-Lunar New Year Fair Fund

i. Subsidy for students' investment

A total of \$1,073.67 was reimbursed. The money was spent on travelling expenses incurred by teaching staff and students visiting the Mainland suppliers.

ii. Consumables

A total of \$381.39 was reimbursed. The money was spent on purchasing display shelves.

9. PARTICIPATION OF DISADVANTAGED STUDENTS IN STUDY TOURS

No study tours were held in the school year due to the global outbreak of the coronavirus disease.

10. SUBSIDY FOR EXPENSES OF JUNIOR FORM STUDENTS JOINING COURSES OF OTHER LANGUAGES

Wong Chun Lap of S3C attended Japanese language courses in the school year. A total of \$2,670 was reimbursed for half of the course fees paid.

11. STAR OF CCSC AWARD

a. 2 awardees for 2018/19:

- Ong Tin Long (S1C) representing HK as a Baseball Ambassador in the Baseball Exchange Programme Hong Kong U15 in Guam
- Wong Sum Yi (S2B) representing HK in indoor artistic cycling competitions in Worms, Germany

b. 1 awardee for 2019/20:

- Koo Ching Ling (S2D) representing HK in the National Youth Finswimming Championship in Wuzhou, China during the period 9 – 18 August 2019. She got 3 relay medals, gold for A grade 4x100 mono, two bronze medals for girls B grade 4x50 bi fin and mix 4x100 bi fin.

This award was a good recognition of the effort of the awardees in competing in international competitions with representatives of other countries.

12. TOPPING UP AWARDS FOR STUDENTS

A subsidy was granted to keep the values of the awards for the Speech Day prize winners (those getting 1st – 3rd prizes, subject prizes and the service award) in line with inflation in recent years and to embody their importance.

13. ACTIVE LEARNING AWARD

In the School Development Plan for 2018 – 22, the promotion of an active learning culture as a major concern. To encourage students to adopt an active learning attitude, an award was offered to those considered by a number of subject teachers as showing the attitude. Book coupons worth \$30 and \$40 were given to junior-form and senior-form awardees respectively. In the first term, there were 32 S1 - S3 award winners and 49 S4 - S6 award winners. Due to prolonged class suspension, the Award was suspended in the second term. Hence only coupons worth \$2,920 were given out. The unused book coupons worth \$2,460 would be kept for awardees in the coming school year.

Budget (2018 – 19): \$6600; expenditure: \$5,917 [\$6,100 worth of book coupons were purchased]

Budget (2019 – 20): \$2,800; expenditure: \$2,716 (a 3% discount from the bookshop)

14. ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNING PROJECTS

a. Outstanding English Ambassador Award

The team helped the English Department to run the English Corner with the NET on Thursdays during lunchtime. All members (34 students) were presented with book coupons valued at \$30 each as a token of appreciation for their assistance in the first term.

b. English Reading Scheme

Recognizing students' efforts on reading, the award scheme continued to motivate students to read extensively after lessons. A total of 48 students from S1 to S5 were presented the awards based on their records in their Reading Logs as part of the GE2 assessment.

c. English Writing Competition (S1 – S6)

Students were assigned to write on a topic set by the teachers of the level concerned. Three prizes were given in each form from S2 to S5 this year. Prizes were presented in the form of book coupons (First Prize: \$100; Second Prize: \$70; Third Prize:\$50).

d. Training on English Debating

With the funding, the English Debating Team continued to hire a coach to provide additional training sessions. The competitions that the team had joined this year included the Hong Kong Secondary Schools Debating Competition, Sing Tao Inter-school Debating Competition and the PTU Debating Competitions.

- a. Owing to class suspension caused by the coronavirus outbreak, the Chinese enhancement class was not held and thus no expenditure was recorded.
- b. Under the writing award scheme implemented this school year, the Chinese teacher of each class nominated the student with the best overall performance in composition writing in the school year to get the award. This award managed to spur students to produce quality work throughout the school year.

16. CHINESE DEBATING TEAM

Owing to the outbreak of the coronavirus disease, most of the debating competitions were cancelled. Hence, money was just spent on the team uniform and travelling expenses of those team members taking part in competitions.

17. PROMOTION OF STEM EDUCATION

- a. Subsidizing the participation of students in non-local or international STEM-related competitions
- b. Subsidizing expenses for organizing a STEM- related activity and participation in STEM–related competitions for students
- c. Subsidizing the procurement of equipment, instruments and consumables for promoting STEM education
- d. Subsidizing the purchase or development of mobile applications or relevant software

No expenditure was recorded for the above items owing the disruptions to the learning activities and competitions brought by the spike in the coronavirus cases.

18. GIFTED EDUCATION PROGRAMMES

Subsidizing expenses of junior-form students joining gifted education programmes organized by local tertiary institutions
